The Stewardship and Finance Committee has been monitoring the Church's financial situation during the last two years. In 2020 during the ten months of shutdown, giving was moderately reduced, but so were the expenses. However, in 2021, as the church resumed in-person worship, committee and other activities, and five-day office hours, expenses have increased, but the giving has remained flat and fallen behind. The Stewardship and Finance Committee is developing a plan to address this situation. Some deficiencies in financial information, in communications and reporting, and coordination have been identified. Following are some of the steps we are taking:

- The Church has purchased new and more robust software for bookkeeping and accounting
- Mike Coffey is setting up the new software and will be working with Chuck Leypoldt in learning the Treasurer's duties.
- The Committee will be continuing to develop and analyze the data on giving/income, including historical comparisons over the

- The Committee will be evaluating whether to do an in-house or outside audit.
- In November, the Committee will conduct the Stewardship Campaign for 2022.

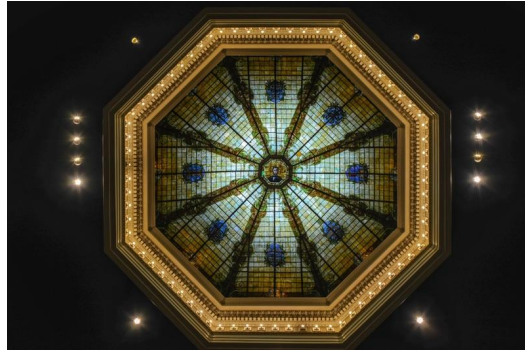
